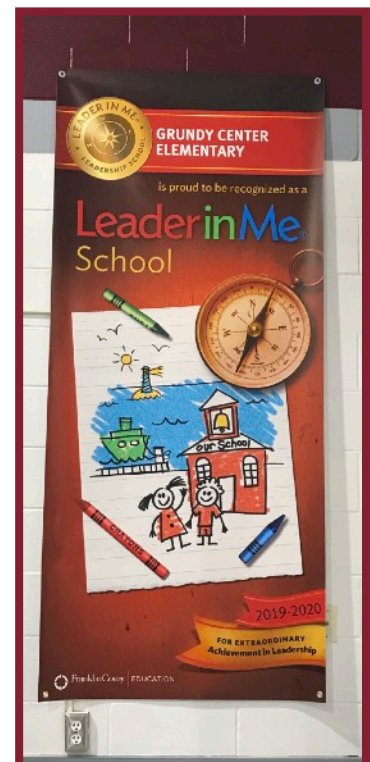
As with every new school year, a few new changes have been made you need to know. First, we are moving our elementary specials schedule back to a 5-day Monday-Friday cycle. This increased the number of minutes students spend at specials and creates a more predictable cycle. The drawbacks are that we had to create Wednesday afternoons with no specials (which affects how we stagger specials throughout the week) to accommodate early out days for professional development, and if there is a snow day, students miss those specials as they no longer roll over to the next day. As always, we continue to look for what will work best for kids, teachers, and the overall schedule.



As a reminder, we do ask that ALL visitors enter through the front door of the school building and stand on the maroon painted feet while pressing the doorbell. This will allow us to visibly see all guests who enter the building. All guests must also check into the office and receive a guest badge before continuing. We have also upgraded our intruder awareness and emergency procedures. As the school year progresses, we will have a digital entry system where all guests wanting to access the building will need a valid government issued ID.

I am happy to announce we will continue our school wide multiage groups called Kids Club. Kids Club allows students from every grade to form their own smaller community within the school. Kids Club is held twice a month for 30 minutes and focuses on the 7 Habits from the Leader in Me.

We at Grundy Center Elementary School are proud to be in our **FIRST** year as a Leader in Me School. Leader in Me is a whole-school improvement process based on the idea that everyone can be a leader. This evidence-based approach empowers students with the leadership and life-skills they need to thrive in the 21st century. What to expect now we're a Leader in Me School?
