the state Teacher Leadership and Compensation System (TLC). Jan Lindeman has stepped away from her third grade classroom to assume the role of Student Achievement Coordinator. That role involves many duties, but specifically addresses student achievement through gradelevel Professional Learning Community (PLC) time, general education interventions, and teacher professional development. Jama Johnson has added to her duties the role of mentor teacher. She works with beginning teachers



and those who are new to our school. She implements a variety of supports including the lowa Teaching Standards and Criteria and beginning teacher Love and Logic training. Title 1 and Reading Recovery teacher, Sue Graham, adds to her day the role of lead teacher. She will be a major support for guided reading and running records implementation with the assistance of AEA 267. We also have Tara Liston, Meghan Norman, and Emily Strohbehn taking on the roles of peer coaches. They will be studying best practices in teaching literacy and possible school-wide positive behavior programs, and bringing those ideas to the team next fall for possible implementation.
